Day 1: The Master Planner

Day 3: Divine Detours

Devotional: We've all been there—following our GPS when suddenly it announces, "Recalculating route." Maybe we missed a turn or took a wrong exit. What seemed like a mistake becomes an opportunity for the GPS to find a new path to our destination. Life often feels the same way. We think we're heading in the right direction when suddenly circumstances change, doors close, or unexpected challenges arise. In those moments, it's easy to wonder if we've somehow derailed God's plan for our lives. But here's the beautiful truth: God's plan sometimes includes taking detours. When we make a wrong turn or face an unexpected obstacle, God doesn't panic or abandon His plan. Instead, He recalculates, using even our mistakes and difficult seasons as part of the journey toward His good purposes. These detours aren't punishments or signs that we've messed up beyond repair. Often, they're leading us to a better view, teaching us something essential, or protecting us from something we can't see. The scenic route might take longer, but it often reveals beauty we would have missed on the main highway. If you're in a season that feels like a detour right now, lift up your eyes. Ask God what He might be teaching you through this unexpected path. Trust that even when the route changes, the destination—His good plan for your life—remains the same.

Reflection Question: What detour in your life initially felt like a setback but later revealed itself as part of God's good plan?

Day 4: True Prosperity

Devotional: When we hear the word "prosperity," our minds often jump straight to financial success—bigger bank accounts, nicer cars, or dream homes. But God's definition of prosperity is far richer and more comprehensive than our culture's narrow focus on material wealth. Biblical prosperity means flourishing in every area of your life. It's about growing in faith that sustains you through any storm. It's developing character that reflects God's heart and builds trust with others. It includes healthy relationships that bring joy and support, a clear sense of purpose that gives meaning to your days, and inner peace that doesn't depend on external circumstances. This kind of prosperity can't be measured by your net worth or compared to someone else's lifestyle. A person living in a modest apartment but growing in faith, serving others with their gifts, and experiencing God's peace might be far more prosperous than someone with wealth but lacking purpose or healthy relationships. God's plan to prosper you isn't just about blessing you—it's about positioning you to bless others. True prosperity overflows. When you're flourishing in faith, character, relationships, purpose, and peace, you naturally become a source of encouragement and hope for those around you. As you trust God's plan for your life, remember that His definition of success might look different from the world's, but it's infinitely more satisfying and lasting.

Day 5: Living the Plan

Devotional: Knowing that God has a good plan for your life is wonderful, but how do you actually live it out day by day?
